Massey University College is located on Massey University's Auckland Campus. Modern, spacious and green, the Auckland campus is in the North Shore area of the city.

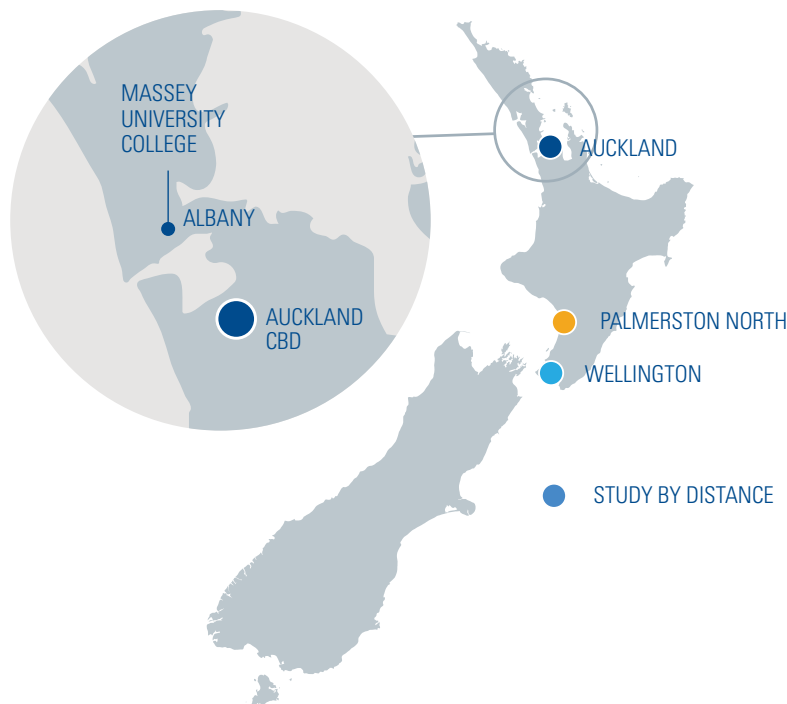
The campus is across the harbour from central Auckland, 15km away.

Whether you're a movie enthusiast, into football or ultimate frisbee, or up for underwater adventures – you'll find a club to suit your interests!

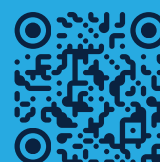

Auckland is built on a volcanic landscape and surrounded by the Manukau and Waitematā Harbours. In fact, it's known as the 'City of Sails' because of the great number of yachts that sail in the harbours and the adjoining Hauraki Gulf.

Cost of Living

COST OF LIVING

In terms of living costs, Auckland compares favourably against other major cities including London, Sydney, Melbourne, Hong Kong, Singapore and New York.

Before granting a student visa, Immigration New Zealand will require you to show you can support yourself for the first year.

As an international student, New Zealand law also states you need to have medical and travel insurance. The easiest option is to buy insurance through StudentSafe which we'll offer to you when you pay your fees.

IMMIGRATION

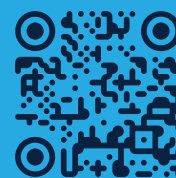

Foundation Certificates

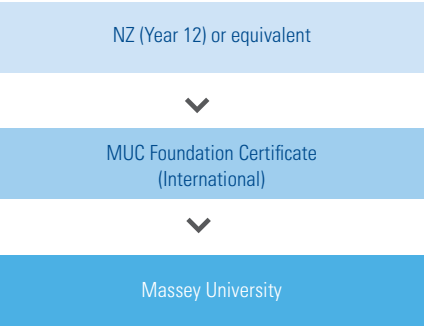
If you don't meet the academic requirements for admission to Massey University undergraduate programmes, the Foundation Certificate (International) can help bridge the gap. It will prepare you for undergraduate study by improving your English and academic skills as well as subject-specific knowledge relating to your chosen degree. This programme is your pathway into the first year of an undergraduate degree at Massey University.

Foundation Certificate (International Accelerated)

The Foundation Certificate (International Accelerated) will help improve your English and academic skills, and prepare you for undergraduate study at Massey University. Entry requirements into the accelerated programme are higher than the standard one because it has a shorter duration of 4 months. Upon successful completion of this Certificate, you are guaranteed admission to all non-selective University undergraduate programmes at Massey University.

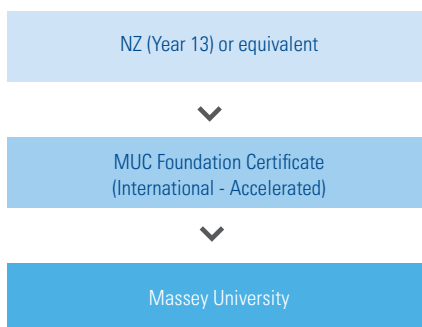

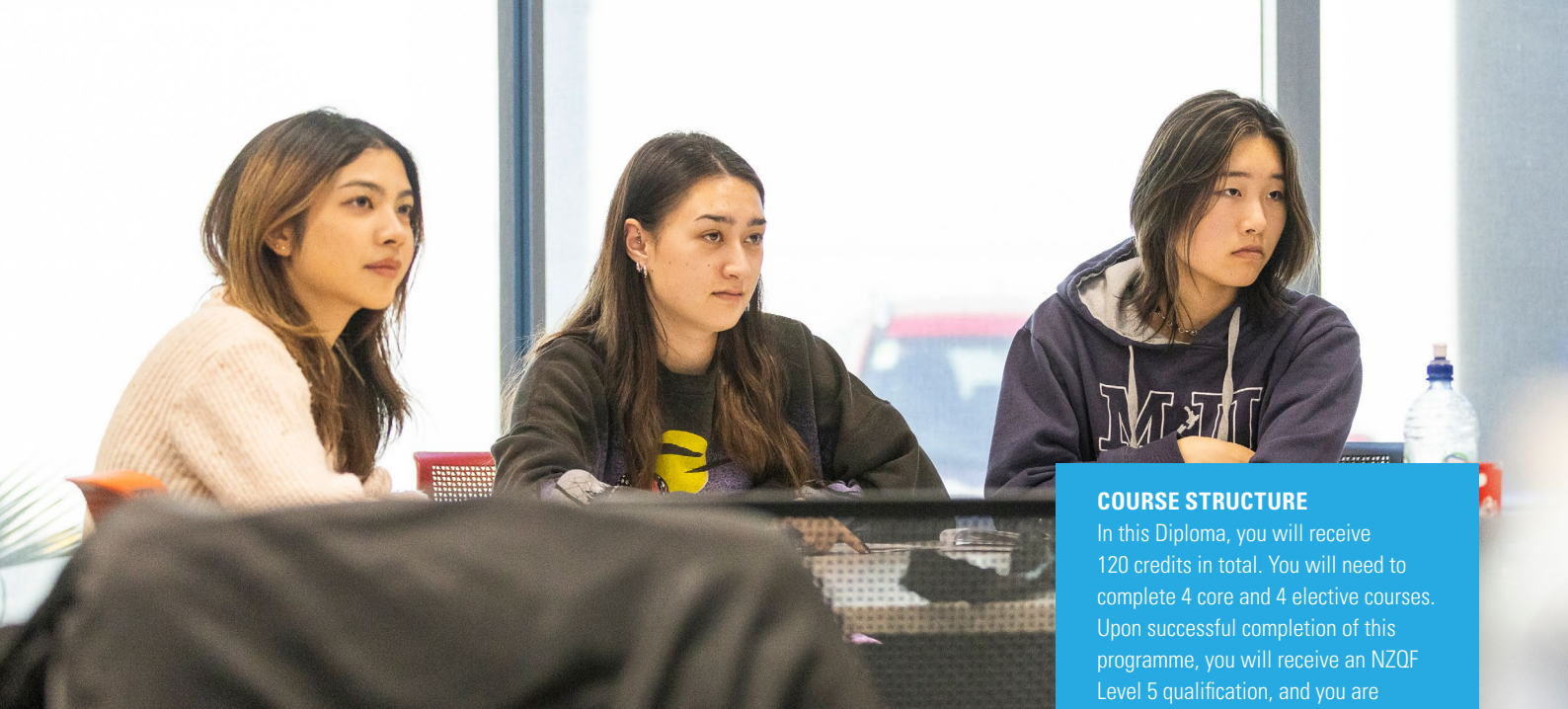

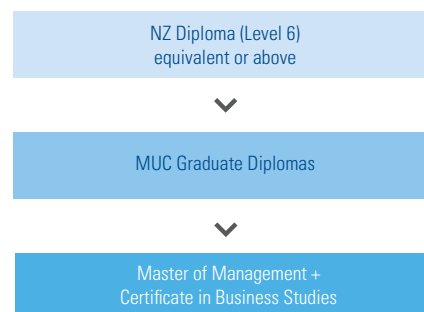

Our English for Academic Purposes (EAP) programme will provide you with an IELTS-free pathway if you meet the academic, but not English language requirements for entry into Massey University. It focuses on various reading, listening and study skills and the strategies necessary for success in academic contexts. It will also help you to develop your vocabulary and grammar, particularly in key academic skills of discussion and presentation.

You'll engage in collaborative learning, structured self-study, and student-teacher dialogue just as if you were studying a bachelor's degree. You can expect a range of multi-media materials and challenging tasks that encourage you to draw on your future study direction or past career experience.

The EAP syllabus and programme dates have been carefully designed to allow students a smooth transition from English to tertiary studies.

ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES 1

If you plan to study our Foundation Certificate (International), and don't meet the English requirements, you will need to complete our English for Academic Purposes 1 (EAP1) programme. If you need to gain extra confidence, you can take EAP1 followed by English for Academic English Purposes 2 (EAP2).

You will be expected to complete 30 hours of study each week, 20 hours of classroom instruction and 10 hours of self-study including research or projects.

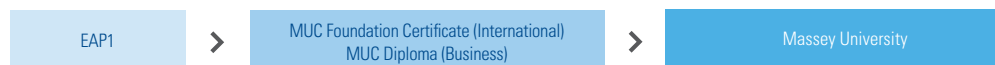

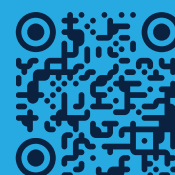

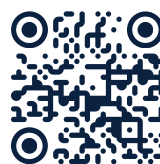
